A Look At FCC Enforcement

4/25/23 – The EB push to try to do something to limit the pirate broadcasters has now reached the concept of fining landlords \$2 million or so. This week, 16 landlords, mostly in New York City, got letters warning of the fines. This is added to previous such letters. Will it have a significant effect? We await word from the FCC.

4/12/23 – 0.111 – The FCC does not revoke licenses too often, but when confronted with owners who were convicted of a felony, the Commission does act. Roger Wahl, owner of WQZS(FM), Meyersdale, PA, was convicted of one felony and four misdemeanors – related to taking hidden camera pictures of a woman and then posing as her online.

The Revocation Order will be effective in May, as the Commission denied Wahl's attempt to transfer the station.

3/15/23 – <u>1.1151</u> – Another station, this one **KIRT in Mission, TX**, has gotten an adverse reaction from the FCC for not paying regulatory fees in 2012, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021 – more than \$30k. The <u>Order to Show Cause</u> gives the station 60 days to pay up or face deletion.

NAB 2023 – Celebrating 100 Years

[April 2023] The NAB Spring Show in Las Vegas has long been the showplace for new products and services. This year was notable for several reasons, including this 100th year of gathering the industry together to meet, see, feel, and discuss the product and regulatory needs of broadcasters.

For 2023 the Annual NAB Spring Show, which concludes today, saw just over 65,000 registered attendees from 166 countries roaming among 1208 exhibitor's booths. (2022 attendance was 53,457)





With the addition of the West Hall in full operation, the NAB s annual convention did seem a bit spread out, tempered a bit, perhaps, by the tunnel and EV car shuttles between the different parts of the Las Vegas Convention Center. But, there was a lot to see, including for broadcasters, the "Broadcast District," as the West Hall was dubbed. The monorail escalator was out of service, so it was a little bit of a hike, but most felt there were some good exhibits. (Word is that next year, the North Hall will be closed for renovation. It should be interesting.)

So far, reports from some of the exhibitors indicate some decent numbers of visitors, to see all the new gear.

SBE Launches Eighth Compensation Survey

Through May 16, 2023, the Society of Broadcast Engineers will conduct a survey to determine salary levels and benefits among broadcast and media technology engineers. The SBE conducted its first survey in 2016. This eighth survey continues to help us establish a baseline for subsequent surveys and build compensation trends.

The complete results of the survey will be available at no charge to SBE members as a benefit of membership. A link to the survey is posted on the SBE website.

With the theme, The SBE and YOU: The Perfect Fit, the SBE will launch the 2023 Membership Drive on March 1, 2023, running through May 31, 2023. As with Membership Drives in previous years, SBE members are encouraged to recruit new members, and in doing so, the recruiter could win prizes from the SBE and donated by SBE Sustaining Members. 




Tornado outbreak of May 31, 1985

On May 31, 1985, a deadly outbreak of more than 40 tornadoes hit Ohio, Perusylvania, New York and Ontario, Canada. It was the 12th-largest tornado outbreak ever recorded in the United States, and among the farthest east and north. An F5 tornado that ripped through Newton Falls and Niles, Ohio, then Wheatland, Pa., was the largest tornado recorded that year.
